Specifically, the research focused on Yorùbá traditional religious material culture exhibited nowadays in museums in the United Kingdom.

Before taking up her current appointment as Reader in Architecture at the University of Lincoln, Anna was formerly Lecturer in Museum and Heritage Studies at the University of Salford, where she was the Programme Leader for the MA Art & Design.

Anna's current research interests are in the fields of museum and heritage studies, material culture (including the material culture of fashion), collectors and collections, identities and diaspora and cultural and creative tourism.
